SCOPE

Natural gas remains a key component of the global energy mix, but its role is undergoing profound transformation. The global energy crisis triggered by Russia's invasion of Ukraine highlighted the geopolitical vulnerabilities of gas supply chains and reshaped international trade flows. At the same time, the imperative to decarbonize energy systems in the EU has intensified scrutiny of gas's long-term place in a net-zero world. Gas and power economies are more and more intertwined. This evolving landscape is forcing firms, policymakers and regulators to grapple with complex trade-offs between energy security, affordability, and climate goals.

This workshop aims to take stock of these developments and to provide a discussion for future research. Four main topics will be addressed:

- (i) The Modelling of Energy Systems
- (ii) Innovation in Energy Transition
- (iii) The Energy Climate Nexus
- (iv) The EU policy and Regulation
